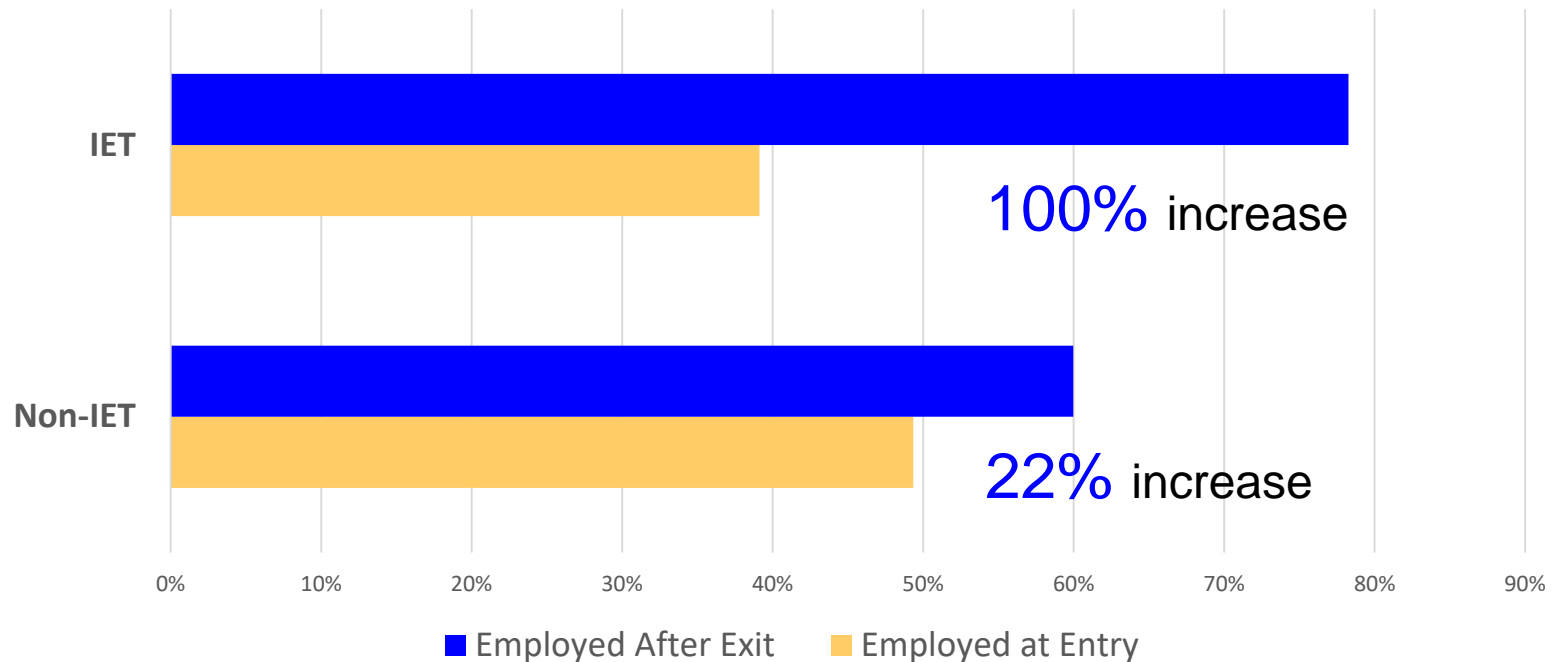

- 423 target for program year 2017-18

 - I-Best has most history

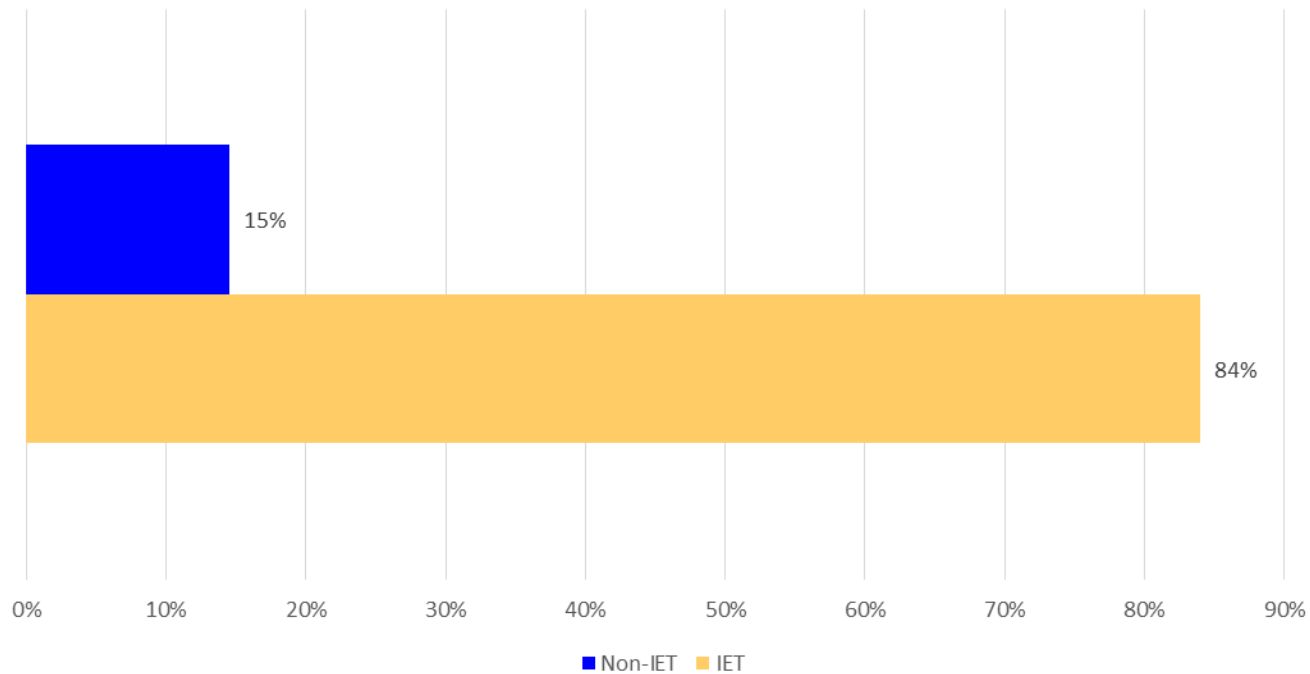
Employment Results in IOWA

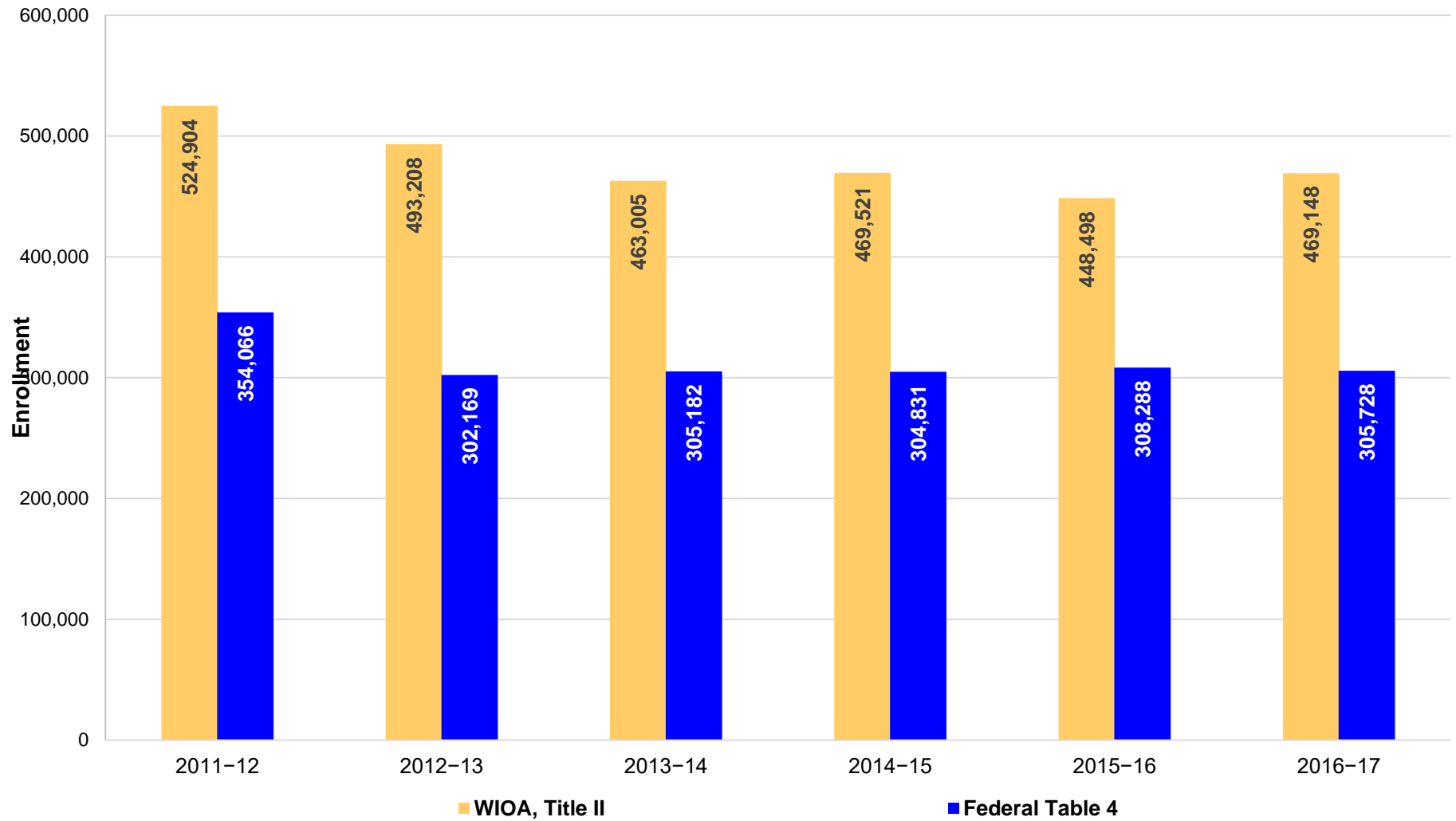




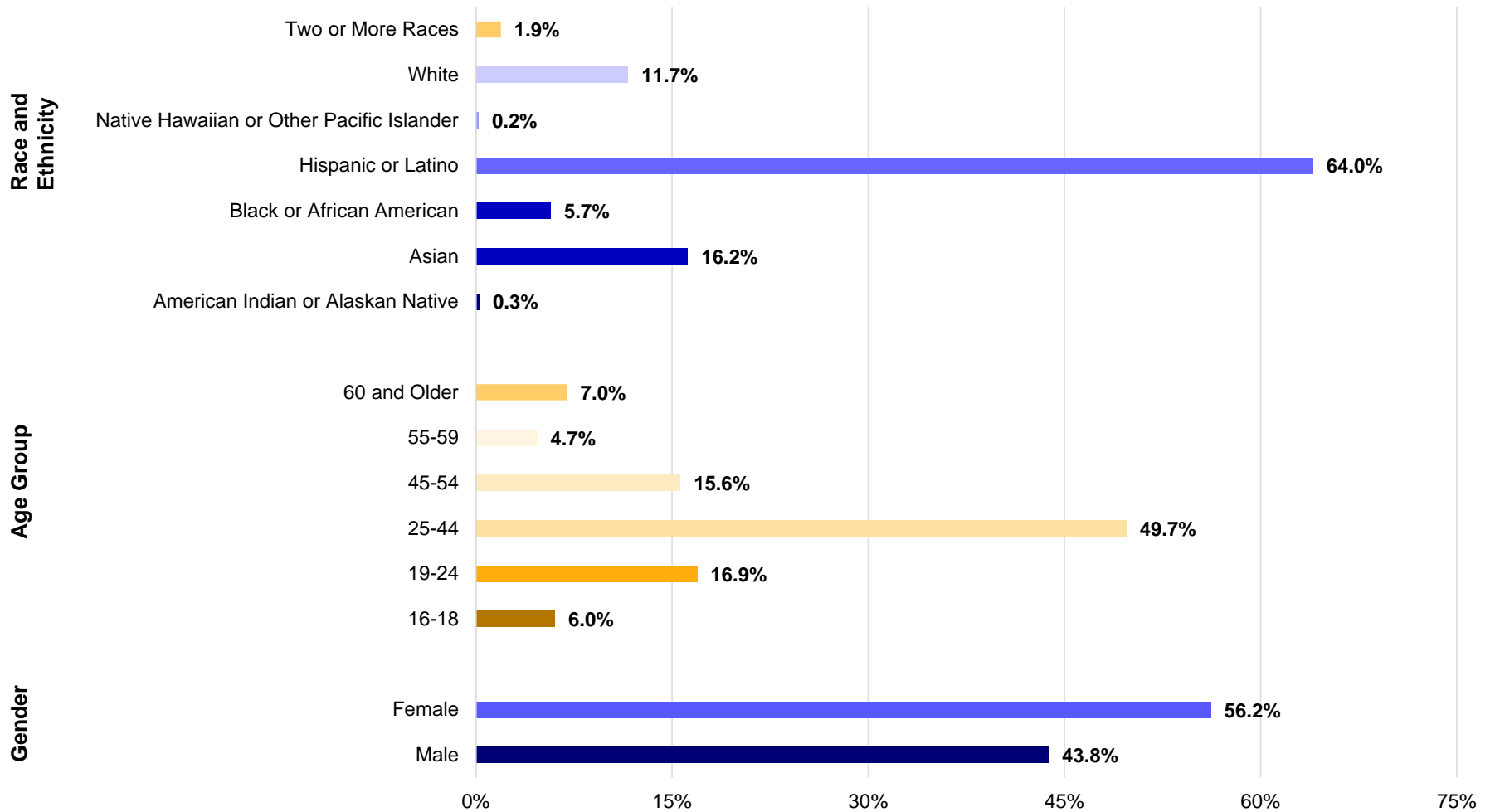
California is the 5th largest economy in the world.

Based on GDP

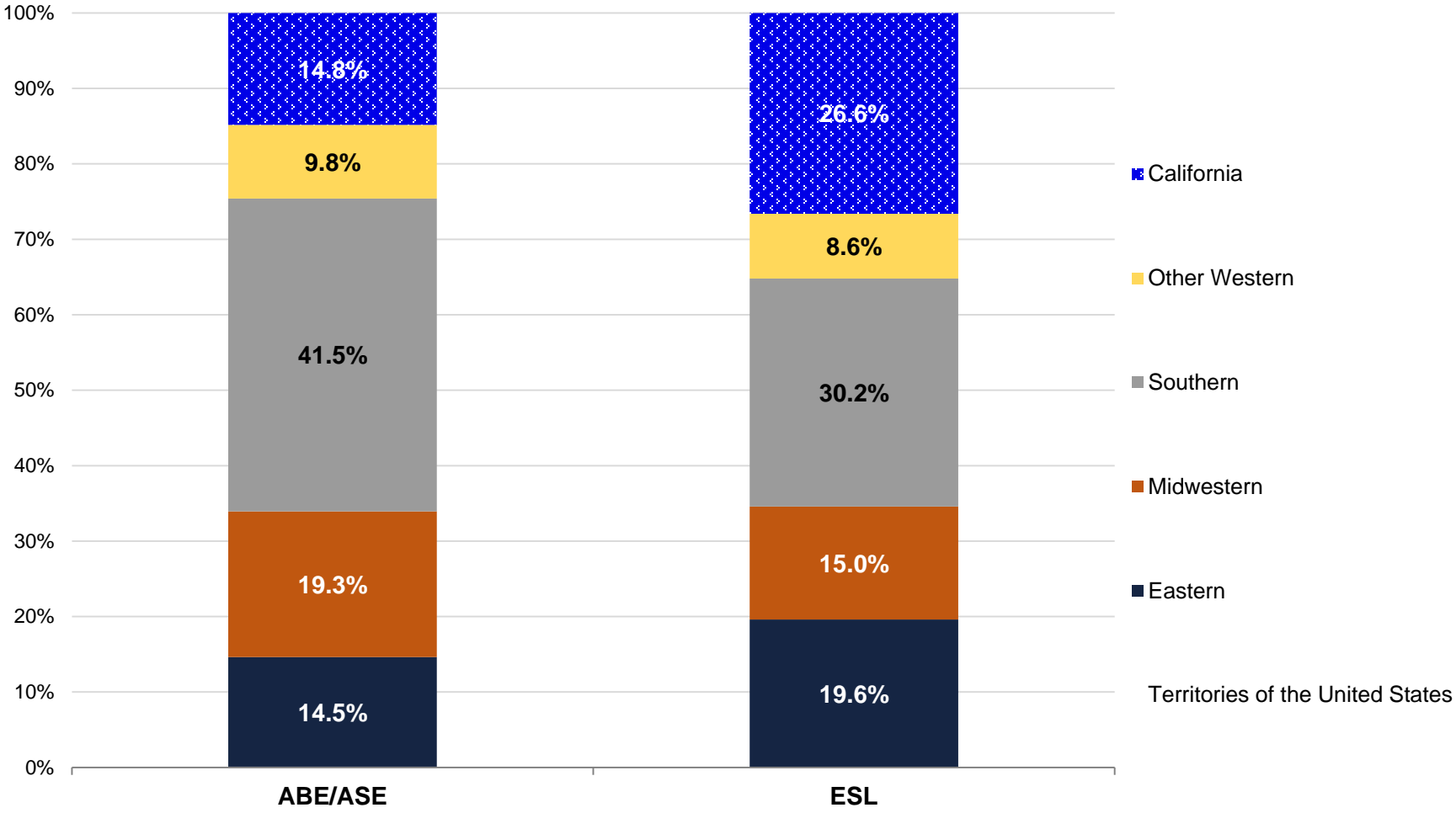
California WIOA, Title II Enrollment



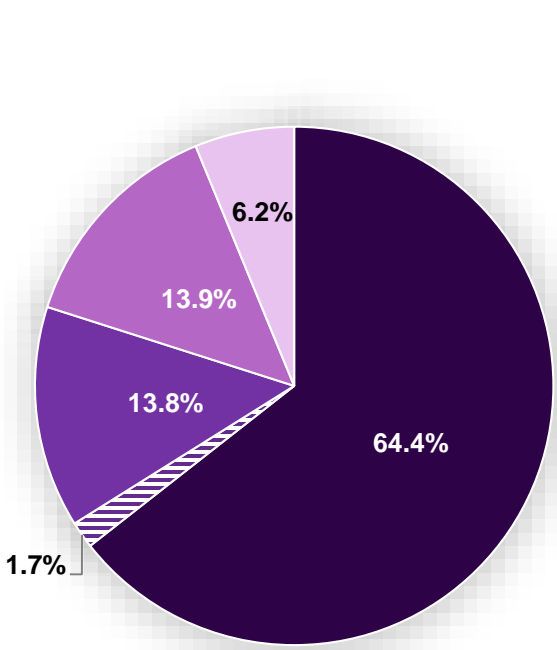
California WIOA, Title II Demographics



2016-17 NRS AEFLA Enrollment

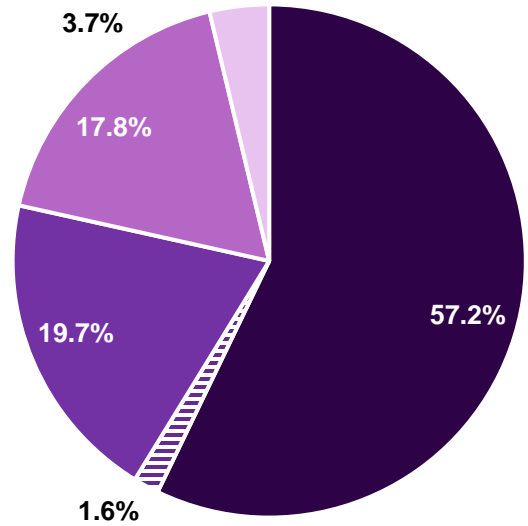

- To meet the IET requirements, an Integrated EL Civics program must:
 - Have a single set of learning objectives and activities organized to function cooperatively
 - Be aligned with the state's content standards for adult education
 - Be part of a career pathway

Co-Enrollment in the Integrated EL Civics Program




In California, learners in an Integrated EL Civics Program must have the opportunity to be co-enrolled in a class or program that offers workforce training within their career pathway.

Civic Objectives and Additional Assessment Plans

- Section 243 COAAPs meet the **workforce preparation** component of IET.
 - Providers in California may adopt existing Section 243 COAAPs or propose new ones
 - Section 243 COAAPs should be part of a workforce preparation curriculum targeting an in-demand occupation or cluster of occupations
