COAAP 36.5:
Identify safe/unsafe
working condition and
explain why.

- In 2020-2021, 94% of Beginning Low-Advanced students enrolled in IELCE classes were able to successfully pass COAAP 36.5 "Workplace Safety."
- Students told teachers and assessors the value of this COAAP in both their work and personal lives. Students can now "see something and say something" when confronted with an unsafe condition.
