**Questionnaire for Students** 

Many agencies also recommend asking the student a few general questions before addressing any of the specific barriers to employment. This helps the interviewer get a clearer picture of the student's situation, and can sometimes "break the ice" with the student and enable the student to share personal information more freely.
