A Brief Overview

Community and Student Needs Assessments

- Identify civic education needs in your service delivery area.
- Provide information about the English language and literacy skills of students to be served.

Community and Student Needs Assessments

- Guide selection of appropriate level(s) and context of civic objectives.
- Guide selection of appropriate instructional materials, community resources, skills assessments, instructional approaches, and professional development.

Key Value of Student Needs Assessment

- Provides info on what learners
 - Want to know
 - Need to know
 - Want and need to be able to do to participate in sustained civic participation
- Informs development of emergent curricula responsive to the needs of learners.

Types of Needs Assessments

- Surveys or questionnaires
- Picture prompts or interest inventories
- Learner interviews or focus groups
- Reading material review
- Language logs or journals
- Language use inventories or reading materials review

The Key

To be effective, needs assessments used with learners and potential learners must be appropriate for the language and basic skill levels of those being assessed.

Employment Survey

- Ask about job requirements
- Obtain job training and education
- Obtain employment related services
- □ Discuss employment rights
- □ Practice job safety
- Understand workplace expectations

Reporting Needs Assessment Results

Be Specific – Data supports decisions

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Picture Prompts – 50 students responded
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40 chose - Places in the Community

35 chose - Child's School

30 chose - Healthcare

15 chose - Family Safety

10 chose - Medicine

7 chose - Kid's Activities

Survey Results

Of 100 Students

The five highest areas of need chosen were:

•	Communicate with health care professionals		
•	Locate community resources		72
•	Practice disaster and emergency		
	preparedness		69
•	Obtain employment related services -		61
•	Communicate with children's school -		59
