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AB 104 AEBG Goal

Enable adults to advance education, obtain employment, and improve wages through a comprehensive California partnership that:

- (A) Improves literacy skills
- (B) Provides completion of high school diplomas or their recognized equivalents
- (C) Delivers completion of postsecondary certificates, degrees, or training programs
- (D) Provides placement into jobs
- (E) Improves wages



AEBG Successes

- Now finishing its second year of implementation (2016-17)
- The proposed 2017-18 budget indicates it as an ongoing program (\$500 million)
- Implemented everywhere in California, through 71 regional consortia
- In 2015-16:
 - AEBG brought together over 1,000 partners to better serve adult learners
 - AEBG served 2.1 million Californians! That included immigrants, adults with disabilities, older adults, incarcerated, homeless adults, and veterans
 - 59% of consortia created, developed, and launched a variety of new programs
 - 39% percent of consortia increased and improved student services such as career and educational counseling
 - Consortia leveraged millions of non-AEBG funds.

Field Team Committees




- Data and Accountability Committee: K12, CC field reps, CCCO, CDE

- CTE Assessment Committee: K12, CC field reps
 - Review/make recommendations to align assessment of CC, K12 AE, and the workforce system, define measurable skills gains and inform the CTE elements of the assessment report to the leg
- Basic Skills Assessment Committee: K12, CC field reps
 - Review/make recommendations to align assessment of CC, K12 AE, and WIOA Title II, defining completion and measurable skills gains across systems and Basic Skills elements of the assessment report to the legislature

AEBG Field Teams

In order to clarify key data elements required for AEBG accountability reporting, and to ensure that metrics help to illuminate student progress in adult education programs, a series of practitioner committees will be convened between May-July 2017.

Data and Accountability Committee

This committee--made up of representatives from K-12 adult schools, community college credit programs, community college noncredit programs, CDE, and the Chancellor's Office--will meet four times to make recommendations regarding data definitions, tracking, and reporting. Before each meeting, WestEd will prepare a white paper that outlines possible approaches, the pros and cons of each option, and how each option relates to both legislative priorities and student pathways. The recommendations of the committee will be recorded in a summary paper and in comprehensive documentation for AEBG grantees on data and accountability requirements.
