

## Basic cooking skills





### Learning basic cooking terminology



- 1. FIFO –first in first out
- Danger zone- The temperature danger zone is 40° F to 135° F, the range in which pathogenic bacteria can multiply rapidly in a food and possibly cause foodborne disease
- Cross- contamination- the process by which bacteria or other microorganisms are unintentionally transferred from one substance or object to another, with harmful effect.
- Cleaning and sanitizing- Cleaning removes food and other types of soil from a surface such as a countertop or plate. Sanitizing reduces the number of pathogens on that clean surface to safe levels. To be effective, cleaning and sanitizing must be a 4-step process. Surfaces must be cleaned, rinsed, sanitized, and allowed to air dry

# Steps to incorporate literacy in the classroom

- This program and the progress we've made has had such a positive impact on the student's self confidence and vision for their future. They say things like "I'm doing things I never thought possible".










Students have reached a level of working ability to completely work independently on projects that interest them and create their own projects.
