# The first steps...Sweetwater's Journey to IET

- Applied for the WIOA IET planning grant in 2017-2018
- Researched the San Diego Workforce Partnership Regional Plans for in-demand careers locally
- Conducted an ELL student survey for input
- Evaluated our current Career Technical Education (CTE) offerings
- Based on regional research, student survey, and current CTE training opportunities, we made our course selections



- ESL for Welding (alternating/DL model)
- ESL for Administrative Professional (alternating)
- ESL for Child Development (alternating/ coteaching models)
- ESL for Medical Terminology (alternating model)

\*Students are co-enrolled in CTE training and ESL-specific courses learning concurrently and contextually

### February-June 2018 (Planning and Communication)

- Weekly 2 hour-planning meetings
- CTE and ESL teachers planned together
- Looked at the big picture-What's our goal?
- Guided questions and discussion
- Development Tool Kit
- Created course descriptions
- Developed course outlines and teaching models
- Aligned courses for a single set of learning objectives to function cooperatively
- Developing our own EL Civics 243 COAAPS (ongoing-process for approval)
- <u>Google Classroom</u>- used to share resources and ideas
