- Pathway to an local or state diploma
- Serves adults and out-of-school youth (OSY)
- Series of simulations that parallel job and life situations.

NEDP History



1975

The External Diploma Program (EDP) is debuted by the Ford Foundation to serve needs of adult learners.

1979

The EDP is validated by the US Department of Education for national dissemination.

2006

The EDP, renamed the National External Diploma Program, finds its home at CASAS.

2013

A revamped online NEDP is launched, aligned to CCRS and pending WIOA legislation.

2020

OCTAE selects NEDP as an innovative practice in the first round of the *Advancing Innovations in Adult Education* initiative.

2022

DOE-funded *Digital Resilience in the American Workforce: Findings from a National Landscape Scan on Adult Digital Literacy Instruction* (DRAW) project names NEDP as an innovator in addressing digital literacy skills.





NEDP: Client Outcomes



- Acquire skills needed to demonstrate mastery of competencies
- Are evaluated against a criterion of mastery instead of comparison to others
- Demonstrate incremental progress rather than relying on an all-or-nothing exam
- Have the flexibility to work and/or obtain workforce training (IET - Integrated Education and Training)
- Earn a local or state diploma

- Short answers, long answers, and slides
- Introduce avoiding plagiarism by paraphrasing and citing sources

NEDP Data



NEDP Clients* may earn up to three NRS measures:

- A Measurable Skills Gain (MSG) when clients transition from Diagnostics to Generalized Assessment
- 2. Secondary Credential Gain, an MSG earned when clients graduate
- 3. Follow-up Outcome when clients exit and become 1) employed or2) enrolled in postsecondary education
