Federal Updates

Continuing Resolution passes without WIOA reauthorization

Dec. 20, 2024 - The 118th Congress will conclude without having completed work to reauthorize the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). This leaves our nation's public workforce system once again at a crossroads as workforce development boards look ahead to the future.

WIOA was last updated in 2014 with an authorization period of five years, concluding in 2019. It remains a national imperative that Congress work to successfully reauthorize this critically important public investment which serves as the workforce ecosystem's backbone in communities and states across this country.



CASAS Assessment – Level A

In consultation with the Office of Career and Technical Adult Education, CASAS is updating score conversion tables for Level A tests on Reading GOALS, Math GOALS 2, Reading STEPS, and Listening STEPS.

- Currently on each of these test series, test takers who score 0 through 3 correct are reported as "inaccurate" with an asterisk (*) instead of a scale score.
- Going forward, test takers will no longer receive an asterisk and will instead receive the lowest scale score on the test (such as 169) and be automatically placed in NRS 1.
- This change applies to CASAS Level A tests only, and is applicable to tests administered since July 1, 2024.


Employment & Earnings Survey

Update on the Gaps: Gap I Qualification



WIOA Collaboration (2)

Continued collaboration with Local WDB's and AJCC 's

 For the first 2-3 years of WIOA implementation, most WIOA II agencies reported minimal collaboration with partners – but in recent years, interaction with both Local Workforce Boards and One Stops (AJCC's) has increased.

WIOA Collaboration (3)

Distinguish role of Local Board vs AJCC/One Stop

- CA has 45 Regional Local Workforce Boards (LWDB's), which govern all WIOA activities for the local region
- Each region has One Stop centers (AJCC's) that provide referrals and short term services directly to clients
- WIOA II agencies have improved collaboration with both partners – but there is confusion about the roles of each partner, and views about the effectiveness of each vary greatly from region to region, and vary between that of the LWDB and the One stop/AJCC.

WIOA Collaboration (4)

Increase engagement with increased student enrollment and revenue

- Most WIOA II agencies have reported improved engagement and collaboration with WIOA partners but without the expected increases in student enrollment or agency revenue
- Ongoing issue about the need to improve practices versus the need for better data metrics and data collection

WIOA Collaboration (5)

Track proposed changes to the Employment Training Provider List (ETPL)

- Each regional LWDB is responsible for developing an ETPL, the list of agencies authorized to provide workforce training for specific occupations in that region.
- From a workforce partner pov administration and guidelines for the ETPL vary from region to region... so there is a state level initiative to provide a consistent set of rules statewide for administering the ETPL in each region.

WIOA Collaboration (6)

Explore positive and negative views of WIOA partners

- "Good news bad news" over the past 2-3 years
- Good news = most WIOA II agencies are more aware of their WIOA partners, and the need for more collaboration
- Bad news = over the past 2-3 years the number of "Neutral" opinions of WIOA partners has decreased – but opinion has split evenly between positive and negative views

WIOA Collaboration (7)

Identify perception of WIOA partners from the Title II pov and of Title II from the pov of the partners

- "Stereotypes" have emerged across the spectrum about the pros and cons of working with WIOA partners, and the impact of collaboration in each region
- Over time there will be a need to share these assumptions in order to better understand each partner's pov

WIOA Collaboration (8)

Shared Training Needs

- In each local region, WIOA partners need to identify priorities and develop pathways for Student Transitions -- to College, Employment, and Workforce Training
- "Aligning to Regional Priorities"

Local Assessment Policy (1)

How does an agency need to respond when a student completes pre/post-testing with less than 40 hours of instruction?

- **Document all exceptions** with a pre/post-test pair but with less than 40 hours of instruction and have the agency administrator give signed approval.
- Recommendation is to use the list of students from DIR Item 22a to demonstrate signed approval.

CDE Training Requirement

CDE Training Requirement – due by January 31st

- CASAS requirement: need to complete only once... and the requirement is at the individual level.
- CDE requirement: need to complete Implementation and WIOA II Accountability, annually – on or before January 31 – and the requirement is at the agency level.

• Yes – as long as the agency administrator has given signed approval and documented with the agency's Local Assessment Policy.
