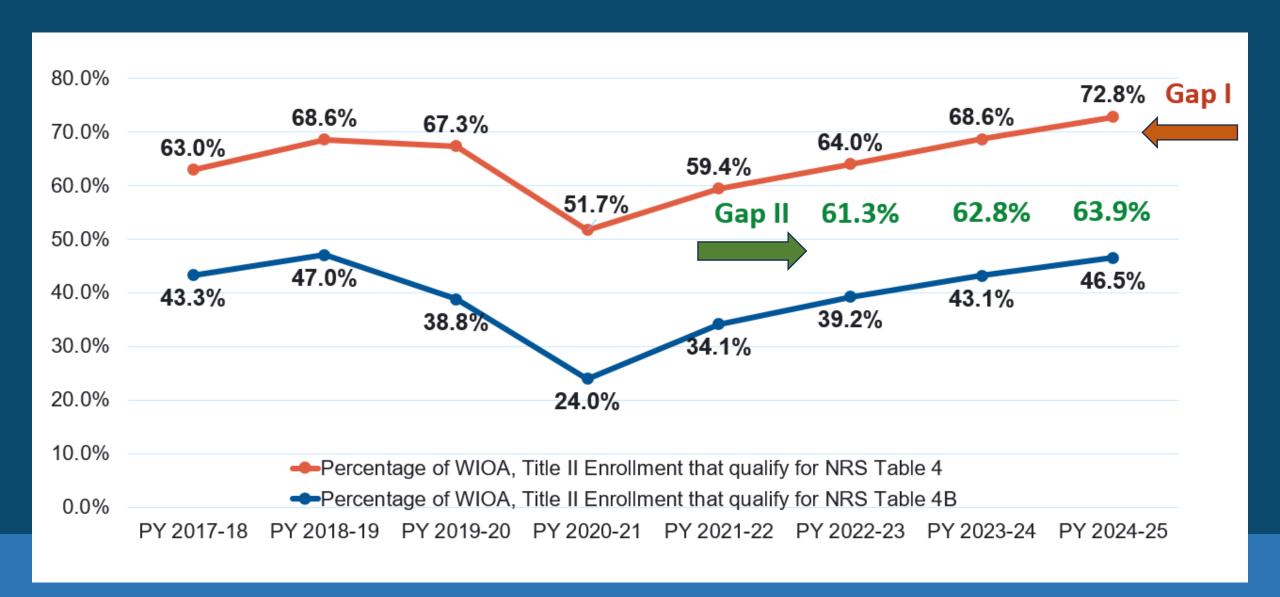

NRS Table 4B displays results by NRS level like Table 4, but only includes students that have completed a pretest and post-test.

### NRS Table 4 vs Table 4B

Q: Why is the number of students in Table 4 and 4B different?

A: Table 4 includes all learners who qualify for WIOA II reporting, while Table 4B only includes students with a pretest and a post-test.

Q: Table 4 has ABE L6 and 4B doesn't. Why is that? A: For the ABE6 EFL, there is no way for a student to achieve a gain other than earning the HS diploma or HSE. There is no way to earn a gain through pre/post-testing, so for "fairness" in accurately reporting student outcomes, this level is not included.

### NRS Table 4 vs Table 4B

Q: The number of EFL gains in Table 4B is sometimes higher... in some cases significantly higher. Should the number of gains be the same on both tables?

A: Usually this will occur for students that earn a pre/post-test level gain in addition to another Measurable Skills Gain.

On Table 4, different types of MSG's are reported, but ultimately only one MSG per student per PoP is allowed.

Table 4B, on the other hand, only displays pre/post-test data, and ignores other outcomes such as HSE and HSD – so for that same example above – on Table 4B, the pre/post gain will be reported.

## Hours of Instruction (2)

#### Entry

1 hour – Reportable Individual

12 hours—Becomes a participant; Qualifies for Federal Reporting

40 hours– Federal minimum between testing

70 hours— CASAS recommended minimum between testing

100 hours – CASAS recommended maximum time between testing

## Hours of Instruction (3)

#### **Program Related Suggestions for 12+ Hours**

- Interview students and staff related to the high (and low) performing areas (by class, program, site)
- Provide short term services
- Implement programs such as "student ambassador"
- Adapt outreach to diverse students needs, such as lowlevel ESL learners, disabilities
- Prioritize appropriate classroom placement
- Look at instruction when students attend and drop.
- "Early Intervention"

## Hours of Instruction (4)

#### Data Related Suggestions for 12+ Hours

- Identify programs, classes, teachers with unusually high (or low) rates of students with less than 12 hours ("Hotspots")
- Relate list of names to local level process for inputting hours (3p import/scan/manual)
- Evaluate zero hours vs. those with 1-11 hours
- NRS Summary Audit
- Drill down to NRS Monitor to relate these students with pre/post results to identify priorities
- Use Class Records to review detailed student level hours data
