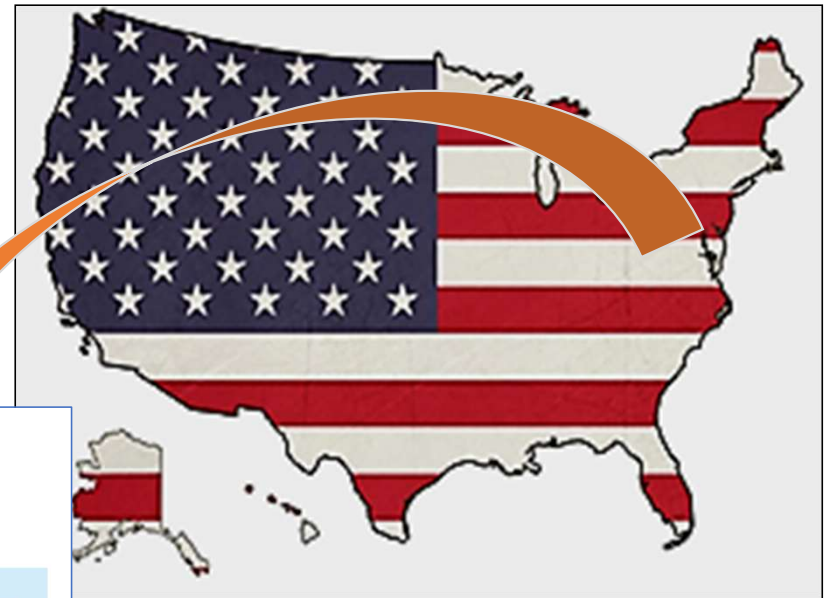

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)

- Federal legislation that passed in 2014 and was implemented July 1, 2016.
- Replaced the 1998 Workforce Investment Act (WIA).

The Four Titles of WIOA Each Authorize Different Programs:

TITLE I

Helps jobseekers with career counseling, job search assistance, and job training.



TITLE II

Helps adults who lack basic skills. Services assist with improving reading, writing, math, and English proficiency; attaining a high school diploma or equivalent; and transition to employment or postsecondary education/training.



TITLE III

Helps jobseekers, including those getting unemployment benefits. Services assist jobseekers in finding work and help employers with recruiting.



TITLE IV

Helps individuals with disabilities maximize their employability, independence, and integration into the workplace and society. Programs offer comprehensive and individualized services including vocational rehabilitation, occupational training, and assistive technologies.

- ***WIOA Title II***: Adult Education and Literacy (AEFLA)
- WIOA Title III: Wagner-Peyser/One-stops
- WIOA Title IV: Vocational Rehabilitation

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WIOA II in California



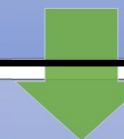
Office of Career, Technical, and Adult Education

- Provides funds to states for adult education and literacy programs.
- Administers and coordinates programs related to adult education, literacy, and career and technical education.



National Reporting System

- A reporting system for federally funded adult education programs developed by the US Department of Education



CA Department of Education Adult Education Office

- Monitors WIOA Title II funded agencies
- Provides information and resources to agencies to maintain quality programs



CASAS

- Helps agencies meet state and federal requirements
- Provides training to funded agencies related to assessment and accountability standards

CAEP Program Structure: 71 Consortia



- There are 71 regional consortia across the state.
- Consortia include ***members*** from community colleges, K–12 adult schools, and COE's.
- Each consortium *may* include community ***partners***.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CA CCD's and K-12 districts are required to participate in CAEP as Members; but only receive WIOA II Federal \$\$\$ through the application process. • Non-College/K-12 agencies such as CBO's have equal opportunity for Federal \$\$\$, but can only participate in CAEP if their region invites them as Partners. • WIOA II stipulates that every state provide opportunities for all agencies, and include Section 225 Jails and Statewide agencies.

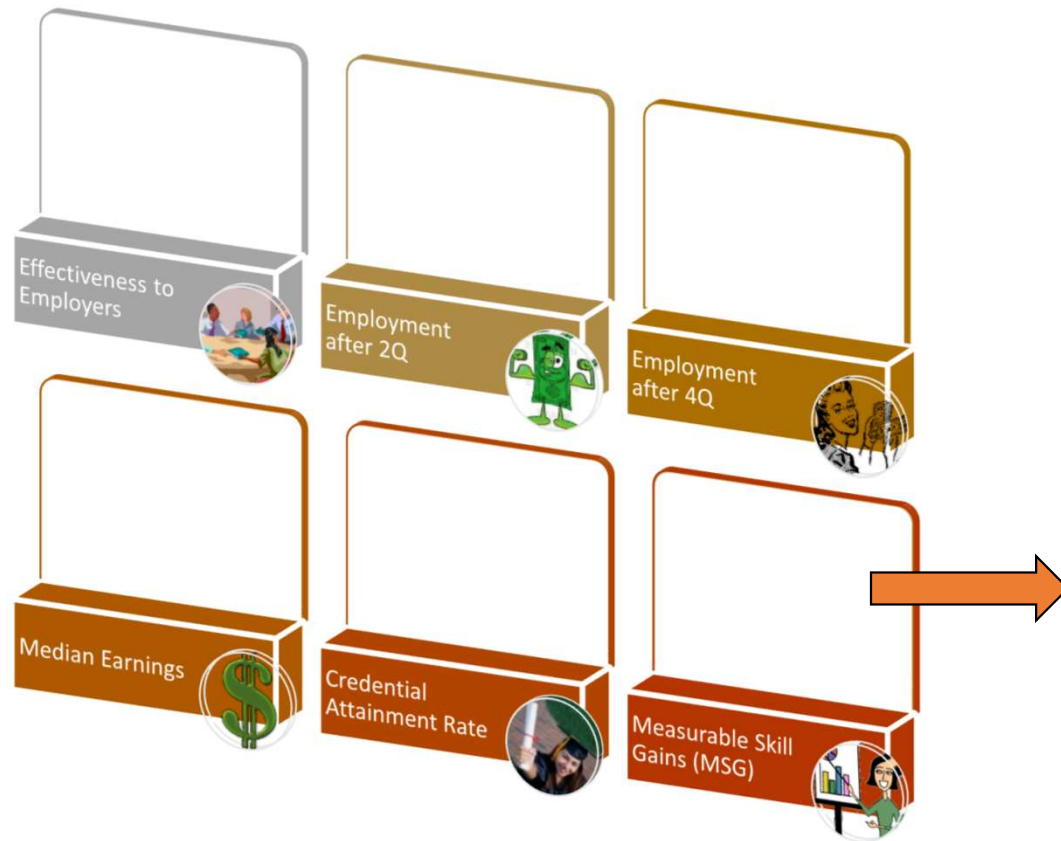

<p><i>Calculates by PoPs</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The NRS uses Periods of Participation for reporting. • 90 Days • A PoP could be longer than a year, or a student could have 2-3 PoPs within a year. 	<p><i>Calculates by PY</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CA Payment Points reports still account by Program Year: July 1 – June 30. 	<p><i>Calculates Enrollees by PY Pre/post by PoP</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CAEP reporting, like CA payment points, uses the Program Year reporting period. • Pre/post gains are directly from Table 4, so in some instances PoPs could affect these outcomes.

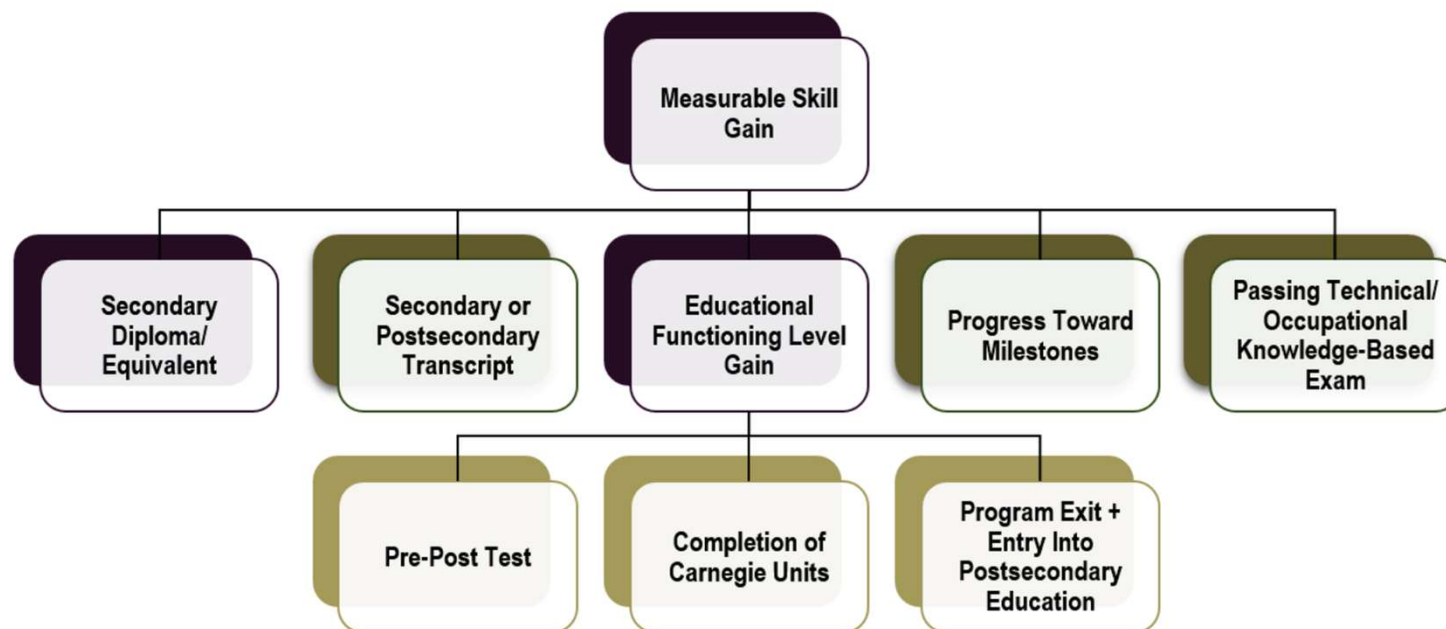
WIOA Performance Indicators



WIOA uses Performance Indicators to evaluate program and student/participant performance.

One of these Performance Indicators is Measurable Skill Gains (MSG). WIOA defines five different MSGs to monitor progress and results.

WIOA Alignment to AB 104

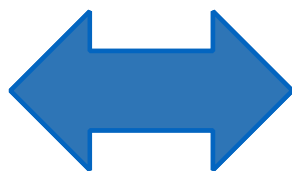
The WIOA Performance Indicators, along with the 5 types of MSG, comprise the framework for the six AB 104 outcomes:

Indicators:

1. Employment
2. Wages

MSGs:

1. Literacy gain
2. Secondary
3. Post-Secondary
4. Training Milestone
5. Skills Progression



AB 104 Outcomes:

1. Improved literacy skills
2. Completion of high school diplomas or their recognized equivalents
3. Completion of postsecondary
4. Placement into jobs
5. Improved wages
6. *Post Secondary Transition*
