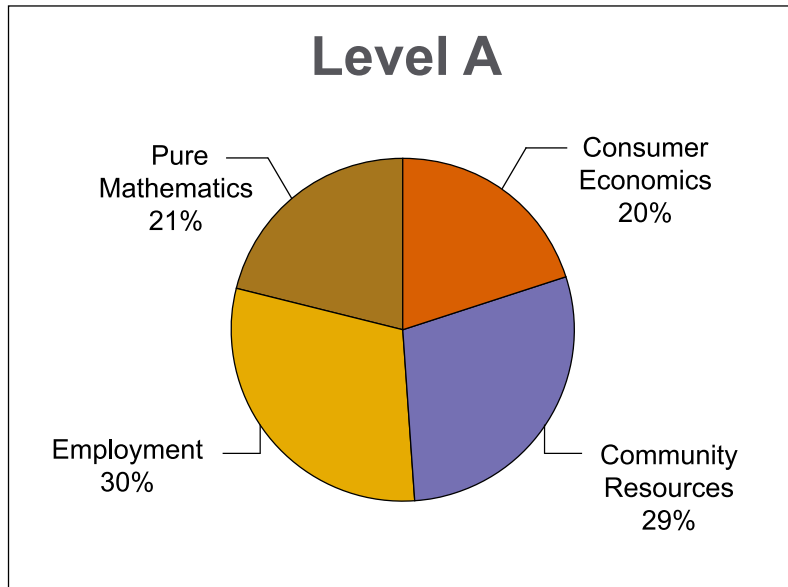

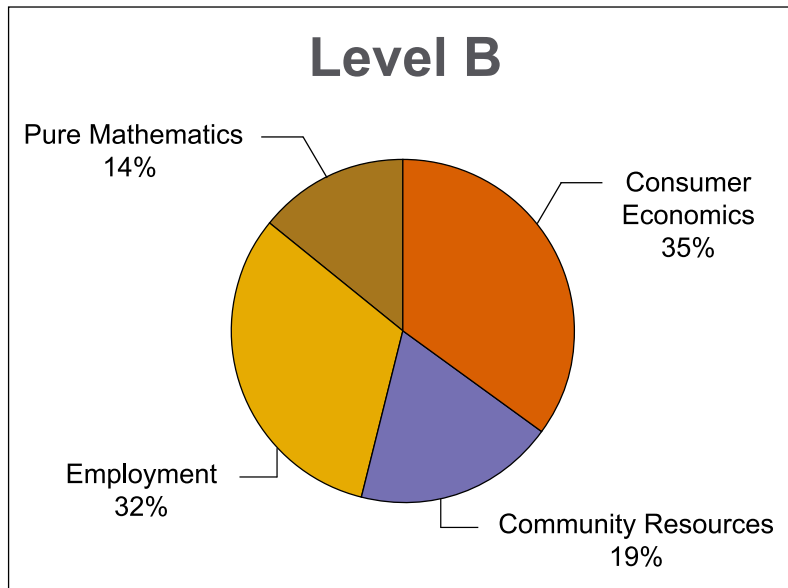

These competencies provide instructional objectives for curriculum and direct links to test content for monitoring student learning. - Pure Mathematics

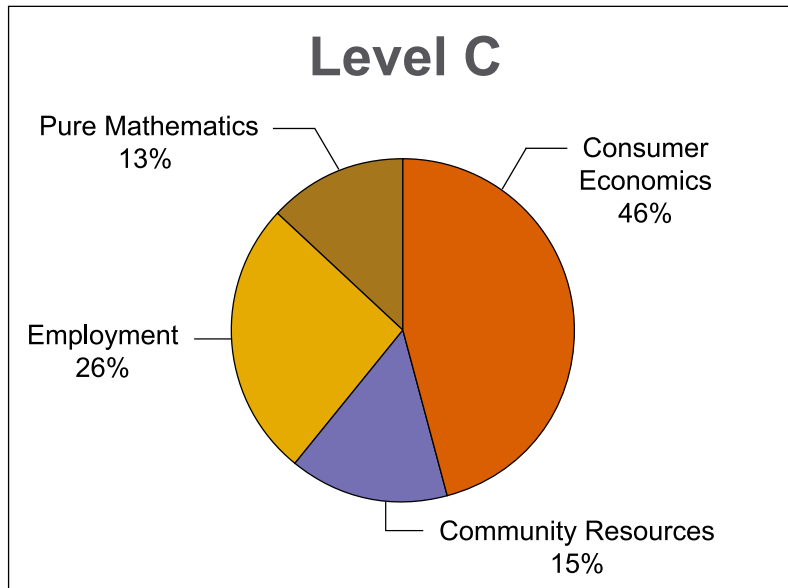
Under each competency area is more specific information about the competencies covered at each level.



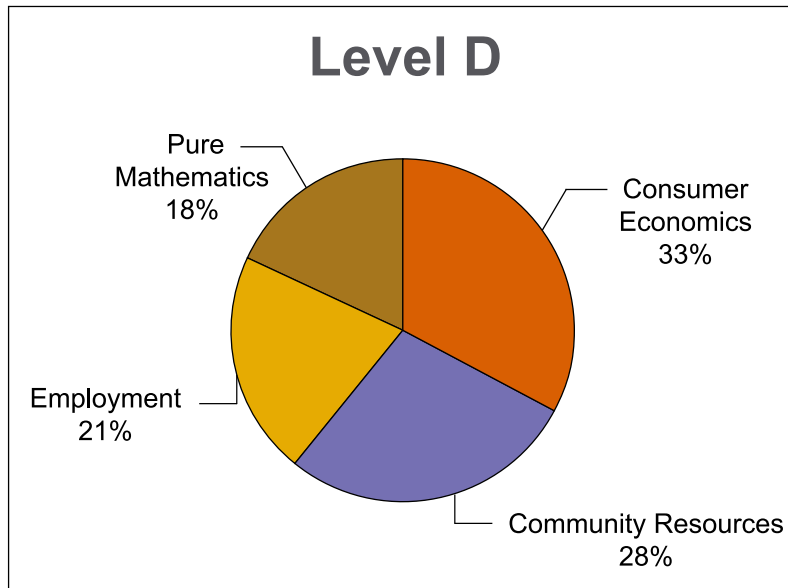

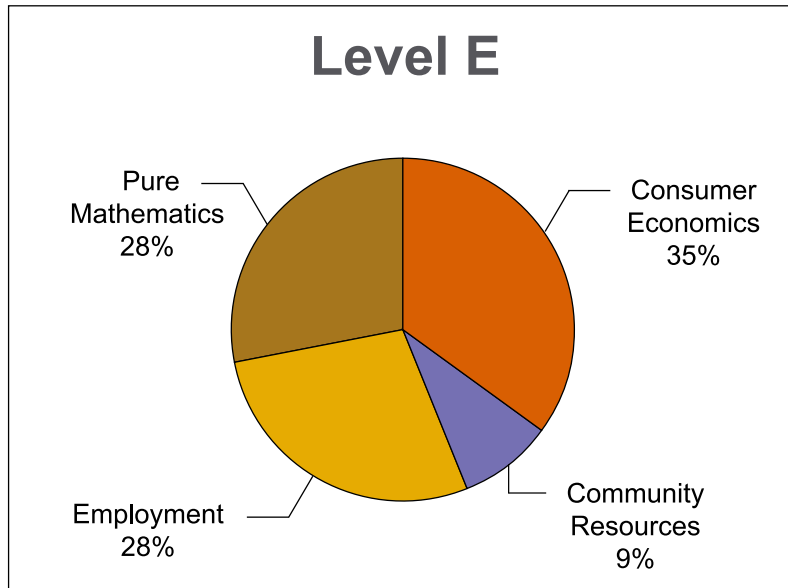
