4 Approaches to Remote Testing

- 1:1 Remote Control
- 1:1 or Multiple Test Takers -- test takers on Windows 10 PCs
- 1:1 or Multiple Test Takers -- test takers on Chromebooks or iPads
- 1:1 Oral Responses

Each approach has unique:

- Detailed, step-by-step, scripted directions provided in the CASAS
 Remote Testing Guidelines document and in proctor training.
 - The Remote Testing Guidelines use Zoom as an example.
- Detailed technical requirements for proctors and test takers



New Directions in Remote Testing

 Some of the current remote testing approaches are temporary and will eventually be replaced by solutions that required more development time.

Possible New Directions

- Remote testing up to 12 students at a time using Approach 2 or 3 (pilot)
- Remote testing of Listening, Reading and Math on phones (pilot)
- Integration of video conferencing into eTests -- in alpha testing
- Remote testing with 3rd party proctoring service, depending on field interest

Reminders about Remote Testing

Remote testing with NRS-approved tests is only permitted using eTests, not paper tests!

It is **NOT permitted** to:

- copy, scan, or reproduce CASAS paper tests
- send NRS-approved paper tests to students
- record the testing session
- Test takers may not use Zoom virtual backgrounds or filtered backgrounds -- so that the proctor can see the room.
- Be creative AND follow the Guidelines to ensure test security.



Remote Testing with Listening

- Consider remote testing with NRS-approved Listening for ESL, even if you haven't previously tested in Listening before.
- Revised Guideline for Listening tests:
 It is permissible for the test taker to use headphones or earbuds for remote testing of listening.
- Send new students the link to the CASAS eTests Sampler to take practice items to become familiar with the format and flow of eTests before taking the test.



Tips for Remote Testing

- Trend to do 1:1 remote testing for ease of implementation
 - Requires less proctor technology expertise
 - Easier to train staff who are new eTests proctors
 - Easier to schedule staff and students to "just get it done".

- Importance of "Part A" preparation for remote testing
 - Tip: Conduct a portion of "Part A" of the remote testing administration procedures in class.



Tips for Remote Testing – Multiple Test Takers

- Consider changing how you conceptualize scheduling for testing multiple test takers –
 - By device availability, or by class and then by device.
 - Send the Zoom link specific to each device group.
- Ask students to complete a short survey about device availability.
 - Don't forget to ask about family devices that could be used for a testing session.
- The number of students scheduled for remote testing determines the number of lead proctors and support proctors or other staff needed.



Sharing the screen with the test taker

- You must view the student's screen before starting the test in order to check that no apps are running except the web conferencing application.
 - Not possible on Chromebooks and iPads.
 - Refer to Part B, Step 3: Test Taker Device Check in the Remote Testing Guidelines document for full discussion.
- Proctors (or teachers or anyone assisting) are then able to see everything that happens on the student's device.
- You can guide students to tap the correct buttons, to locate the home screen icon, and so on.
- It can also be useful during the test, because it allows you to see what the student sees. You might see notifications and attempts to cheat, for example.



Sharing the screen with the test taker

- Important: Sharing the screen uses additional internet bandwidth, along with that already used by the camera and microphone.
- If a participant has a low-bandwidth connection (less than about 3-4 Mbps), then consider not sharing screens while the student is taking a test, as this will allow the audio/video streams to use what little is available more effectively.



Sharing the screen with the test taker

- Important: Sharing the screen uses additional internet bandwidth, along with that already used by the camera and microphone.
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Communication between proctor and test takers

- Establish a protocol for what happens when the test taker has a question, and/or if you get disconnected during the testing session.
- Communicate this to the test taker at the beginning of the session.
- Establish a channel of communication with the students. For example, raise your hand and I'll see you on camera; or say something to me; or type in the chat; or text me on your phone, etc.



TE Update




TE Data Transfer Wizard

 Allows you to request test data or student demographics from another agency.





 Partner agency receives the request inside TE and approves or denies it.






Student must sign consent form to share data.





- Transferred tests include complete item responses
 - Usable for item-level reports like Competency Performance and Content Standards.





When is this new data sharing feature useful?

- A student transfers to a new school just weeks after taking a CASAS test at a previous school.
 - Avoids over-testing
 - Immediate intake
- A workforce agency refers a student to a school for instruction/remediation.
- A state decides to share student data among agencies using the wizard.

Reading Level Indicator (RLI)



How to determine a student's level (EFL) if you can't pretest yet?

- OCTAE May 29, 2020 (memo 20-5)
 - Suggested using an informal assessment for provisional placement in an NRS level for Table 4
- CASAS Form 601R, a new provisional placement tool
- May be taken without a proctor
- May be taken on a mobile phone or other device
- Online and Paper versions
 - No charge for online version for TE users



Reading Level Indicator (RLI)

- Target audience:
 - All ABE/ASE students and
 - ESL students at NRS ESL Level 3 and above
- Results are shown as "Estimated NRS EFL" for ABE or ESL.
- No scale scores are given.
- NOT an NRS-approved test
- May NOT be substituted for pre- or post-testing for MSGs
- Administer an NRS-approved pretest as soon as possible.
