About the Bibliography

The 2008 CASAS *Bibliography of Citizenship Materials* lists available instructional resources for citizenship education. It focuses on materials appropriate for preparing people for the naturalization process and the standardized citizenship examination. Resources include textbooks, audio materials, software and Videos/DVDs. The bibliography also provides sections on civics, U.S. History and Government, U.S. culture, and professional resources. This edition provides many new materials, including current Web site listings.

Annotated Format

Entries have been updated and annotated. Some resources that appeared previously are now out-of-print and are not included in this edition.
