Options for Adults with Intellectual Disabilities

Literacy skills are essential for EVERYONE to function in the twenty-first century.

To serve the specific needs of adults who have intellectual disabilities, CASAS offers two standards-based assessment systems. The goal of both systems is to enable adults who have intellectual and print disabilities to progress on the CASAS scale toward Beginning Literacy. Both systems are administered one-on-one and in the individual's mode of communication.

The **Adult Life Skills** assessments display a selection of color photos and expand across all CASAS competency areas including basic communication, consumer economics, health and learning to learn.

POWER (*Providing Options for the Workplace, Education, and Rehabilitation*) assessments are performance-based and each assessment focuses on a specific competency area such as independent living, community assess and employment preparation.

Test levels in both series correspond to support needs for intellectual functioning levels of mild (Level 2A), moderate (Level 3A), and severe (Level 4A/5A).
